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Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of all members of Ankleshwar Industries Association for the year 2018 -19 held on 20/07/2019 at AIA Centre for Excellence Auditorium, GIDC Estate, Ankleshwar at 4.00 pm.

List of Members present in the meeting is annexed.

Due to insufficient quorum, the meeting scheduled at 4.00 pm. was adjourned for 15 minutes and after 15 minutes considering the quorum as full, the adjourned meeting was commenced at 4.15 pm. with prayer to transact the following business, under the chairmanship of Shri Ashok N Chovatia, Vice President:

1. Two minutes silence was observed to pay tribute to the residents of GIDC Township, passed away during the year.
2. The Hon. Gen. Secretary, Shri Jayesh H Patel welcomed all present members and his colleague Managing Committee members in the meeting.
3. Shri Jayesh H Patel, Hon. Gen. Secretary took attention of members to the minutes of the last Annual General Meeting held on 20/07/2018 and made appeal for approval of the minutes. Members took note of the contents of the minutes and approved them unanimously.

The Hon. General Secretary briefly described the present situation that in wake of Hon'ble National Green Tribunal order dated 10/07/2019, putting Ankleshwar and other industrial clusters under Critically Polluted Industrial Estate category again, most of the office bearers are away at Gandhinagar to attend a meeting convened by the Chairman, GPCB today. Pursuant to the clause 20 of the Articles of Association of Ankleshwar Industries Association, the Annual General Meeting has to be convened on or before 20th July, but in absence of the main office bearers, continuing further proceedings of the meeting is found to be difficult.

He then sought opinion of the General Body regarding proceeding ahead with further agenda of the meeting. After detailed discussion, it was decided to adjourn the Annual General Meeting to one week and hold the meeting on 27/07/2019 at the same time and venue with the remaining agenda.

Meeting was then adjourned to 27/07/2019 with vote of thanks to the Chair.



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Minutes of the adjourned Annual General Meeting of all members of Ankleshwar Industries Association for the year 2018 –19 held on 27/07/2019 at AIA Centre for Excellence Auditorium, GIDC Estate, Ankleshwar at 4.00 pm.

Due to insufficient quorum, the meeting scheduled at 4.00 pm. was adjourned for 15 minutes and after 15 minutes considering the quorum as full; the adjourned meeting was continued at 4.15 pm. to transact the remaining agenda points, under the chairmanship of Shri Mahesh J Patel, President:

4. Approval of Audited Annual Accounts for the year 2018-19:

The Hon. Treasurer, Shri Amulakh N Patel, presented the audited annual accounts for the year 2018– 19. Members approved the audited accounts unanimously.

5. Appointment of Accounts Auditors for the year 2019-20:

Shri Amulakh N Patel proposed to appoint M/s. G N Shah Associates, Chartered Accountants, rendering services for more than 29 years to the organization as Accounts Auditors for the year 2019-20 or to suggest name of any others. Members took note of the services rendered by M/s. G N Shah Associates and approved their appointment as Accounts Auditors of Ankleshwar Industries Association for the year 2019-20 at the same remuneration of previous year.

6. Report on AIA Industrial Expo 2019:

Shri Pravin S Teraiya, Expo Chairman presented the report of AIA Industrial Expo 2019 organized during 03-05 January 2019 at D A Anandapura Sports & Cultural Centre. He said that the total turnover of the Expo was Rs. 1,25,12,987.00 with sponsorship and interest income of Rs.15,15,639.00 out of which Association could gain a profit of Rs. 58,11,658.00 after expenditure of Rs. 82,16,968.00. Turnover, expenditure and profit are more or less same as last year. We could have increase the turnover this year, but due to Vibrant Gujarat Summit during the 2nd week of January, some exhibitors could not participate in our event as well approximately 30 stalls of SC/ST category which were coming through NSIC did not participate in the event. Shri N K Navadia pointed out that so far as voluntary organizations like ours is concerned, we should replace the word of profit with surplus.

Shri Pravin S Teraiya thanked all managing committee members, Expo committee members and those who directly indirectly put efforts to make the event a grand success. Members appreciated the efforts put in by all concerned for making the event a grand success.

7. Report on Ankleshwar Waste Management Limited:

Shri Ramesh D Gabani, Chairman, Ankleshwar Waste Management Limited gave brief details about the projects of the company promoted by Ankleshwar Industries Association jointly with the Notified Area Authority as SPV. Process to increase the capacity of CETP from 10 to 15 MLD is in progress.

8. Presentation of Appreciation Certificates to the retiring Members of Managing Committee:

Shri Mahesh J Patel, President jointly with other office bearers presented appreciation certificates to the retiring managing committee members namely, M/s. Amulakh N Patel,



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Prabodh B Patel, Manoj B Patel, Himat B Sheladia, Nitin K Dama and Gp. Capt. A. G. Chitre in recognition of services rendered by them in the activities of the organization.

9. Ratification of Managing Committee Election:

Shri Ashok N Chovatia, Vice President read out the names of retired managing committee members on completion of their term and on behalf of the organization expressed deep sense of appreciation to them for the services rendered by them in the activities of the organization during their tenure as managing committee members.

He declared that in response to the notice regarding election to the managing committee for the year 2019-20, 2 nominations in Corporate Category, 1 nomination in Reserve Category and 11 nominations in General Category were filed. After scrutiny, 1 nomination in Corporate Category, no nomination in Reserve Category and 11 nominations in General Category were found valid. Till last for withdrawal, nil nomination in Corporate Category and Reserve Category and 3 nominations in General Category were withdrawn. Therefore, against vacancy of 1 seat each in Corporate and Reserve Category and against 7 seats in General Category, 8 candidates in General Category were remained. Therefore the candidates, 1 in Corporate Category elected unopposed and election amongst 8 candidates against 7 seats was conducted on 28/06/2019. Election Result is as under:

Members congratulated the elected members and ratified the election result. The newly elected managing committee members namely M/s. Bodar Ramesh K, Gandhi Jatinkumar B, Gondaliya Umesh D, Patel Dinesh R, Panchal Kamlesh K, Gabani Ramesh D, Vekariya Rakesh S and Rai Surendra S came on stage and altogether took oath to honour, observe and abide by the constitution of the organization and to work collectively in the interest of the industrial community.



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10. Presentation of Annual Activity Report for the year 2018-19:

Shri Mahesh J Patel presented the annual activities report in nutshell. He said that except environmental issues, Year 2018 – 19 proved to be an eventful year for all of us. During this year, so far as problems related to industrial development are concerned, some of the problems were sorted out. But due to environmental issues there is slowdown in business scenario. I am sure; with collective efforts and co-operation of all, we can overcome the issues in the coming days.

As per the tradition of the Association, maintenance of infrastructure and basic amenities has been carried out on regular basis. Anganwadi constructed on Residential Plot No. 3185/2 @ Rs. 50.00 lakhs has been started on 03/07/2018 with 40 students and this year above 60 students have been admitted. Construction of Senior Citizen Activity Centre @ Rs. 2.00 Crores has been completed. Rules & regulations for membership of the centre is being finalized and the centre will start functioning soon.

Under STRIVE Project; the Government of India has sanctioned Rs. 1.00 Crore for establishment of Skill Development Centre. This project is being implemented through AEPS.

For Low Cost Canteen for workers, it has been proposed to start construction @ Rs.4.00 Crores. For this project, application for grant under Annapurna Scheme has been submitted to the Government and approval is being awaited.

For the SSI units of Ankleshwar, 10 MLD CETP is being established on the plot admeasuring 30000 Sq. Mtrs. area allotted by GIDC @ 50% of the industrial price. For Bhoomi Poojan of CETP and other facilities under Ankleshwar Waste Management Limited, request has been made to the Chief Minister and other ministers and confirmation from them is awaited.

GIDC has allotted 45,000 Sq. Mtr. plot to Ankleshwar Waste Management Limited for setting up Interim Co-Processing Facility, Spent Acid Exchange & Management Facility, Decontamination Facility etc @ 50% of industrial price. Similarly GIDC has allotted to the Notified Area Authority, a plot of 17,000 Sq. Mtrs. for domestic waste disposal site @ 50% of industrial price, which will be developed @ Rs. 2.00 crores soon. Representation for token price allotment of these plots has been made.

In view of the water supply crisis, project proposals worth Rs. 54.00 crores for laying new 1000 mm dia line from the main stream of Ukai Right Canal near Panoli to Ankleshwar Reservoir, deepening and concreting the base of Reservoir at Ankleshwar to enhance the storage capacity from 840 to 1450 MLD have been submitted to GIDC and pending approval. Similarly, to draw 22.5 MLD water from Rundh as per the agreement, GIDC has been requested to lay new line from Rundh to Ankleshwar. If these projects are implemented, Ankleshwar do not have to face water crisis and normal supply to 7 villages around the estate can be maintained.

For underground electrification of the estate, project proposal under AII Scheme was submitted to the Government. Since the project estimate was above Rs. 65.00 crores, it was found that with the grant and 20% share of DGVCL, the project will not be viable, due to the ceiling of maximum Rs. 25.00 crores. Therefore it was decided to divide the project into



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two parts and initially to take up 66 A & B Sub Stations @ estimated cost of Rs. 45.00, so that with the maximum grant of Rs. 25.00 Crores from Government and 20% from DGVCL and balance from the industries, the project can be implemented.

Resolution:

"It was then resolved to advise the Notified Area Authority to work out per KVA contribution from the beneficiary industries covered under 66 A & B Sub Stations on the basis of connected load of the industry".

So far environmental issues are concerned, all issues have been representing to GPCB, CPCB, MoEF&CC from time to time. AIA has been made party in the case filed by NCT in the Hon'ble High Court. We have also been requesting NCT to carry out upgradation of FETP, Conveyance System, enhancement of capacity of FETP from 40 to 60 MLD, construct Booster Pumping Station near Sajod as well as to hand over the management of NCT to the Industries Associations of Ankleshwar & Panoli. Proposal is under due consideration.

As directed by NCT, 14 flow meters at the problematic locations have been installed by the NAA. Based on the reading of these flow meters, NCT has introduced new billing method since April 2019 on 4 months trial basis.

As per the directives of the Hon'ble High Court, old drainage network has been removed and laid over-ground pipeline at the problematic locations.

For fixing up deep sea norms for NCT, an intervention appeal has been made in the Hon'ble NGT. Due to intermittent postponement of dates, the hearing could not take place, which we expect soon.

Recently on the basis of CEPI Score of December 2018, the Hon'ble NGT by its order dated 10/07/2019 directed the CPCB to put Ankleshwar and other cluster under Critically Polluted Industrial Estate category. It is learnt that both the CPCB and MoEF&CC are likely to challenge the order in the Supreme Court.

Resolution:

"It was then resolved unanimously to challenge/file review petition in the Hon'ble Supreme Court against the order of Hon'ble NGT. Expenditure thereof will be borne by NCT and if not, industries will share the expenditure".

Detailed report on various activities carried out by the Sub Committees formed for the year 2018-19 are annexed in the annual report provided to all.

He expressed sincere thanks to all his colleagues in the Managing Committee and Sub Committees for their support and co-operation extended during his tenure. He also expressed gratitude to all member industries for their support and co-operation extended to the activities of the Association throughout the term.

11. Open Session:

During open session, Shri Navin Patel pointed out that the sports complex ground is not cleaned properly after the exhibition. Shri Pravin Teraiya said that immediately after the event is over, domes and other structures are removed and undertake normal cleaning of the



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area used for exhibition and further cleaning of the site is the responsibility of the owner of the sports complex.

Shri Navin Patel said that 'C' Pumping Station is closed by GPCB in every six months. A permanent solution should therefore be brought. Due to scarcity of water, most of the industries are depended on tanker supply. Shri Mahesh J Patel said that to sort out the 'C' pumping station problem, over-ground line for industries is being laid, but still there is problem of level and gravity of line. Regarding water scarcity, efforts are being put on. For rainwater harvesting, housing societies are being encouraged. 35 housing societies erected rainwater harvesting system and they have been awarded subsidy of Rs. 15,000/= each.

Shri Chandubhai Kothia pointed out that regarding abnormal rise in the billing of NCT, two letters have been submitted. Since introduction of new billing system, bill amount have been increased exorbitantly. Shri Mahesh J Patel said issue of abnormal billing is being reviewed and advised the MD, NCT to revise the erroneous bills on the basis of new formula finalized. The MD has been given notice by the NCT management. On salary increment and other issues, there is discontent amongst the employees.

Shri Dinesh Patel felt that Shri Alok Kumar should be removed from NCT. For Jhagadia, separate SPV should be formed. Punishment action should be taken against Ms. Preksha Pandya.

Shri Jivraj Kakadia felt that intervention of Association in the issues related to ETL, particularly additional bill raised to the industries is not effective. For ETL separate flow meter has been installed and NCT is billing ETL based on the reading of this flow meter. Then ETL should bill its members in accordance with ETL bill. Shri Mahesh J Patel, President replied that Association had tried to intervene in the additional billing by ETL for several times. Even on repeated requests ETL did not give time for combined meeting. A committee under the leadership of Shri Jivraj Kakadia was to meet ETL Management, but the committee did not give any report about its meeting with ETL management. Moreover, the President on Board of ETL as Director by virtue of post has been removed citing the provisions of section 167(1)(b) of the Companies Act, 2013. Since we felt that this clause may not be applicable to the Nominee Director, expert opinion is being sought. However, the issue has been taken up at higher level. Shri Jivraj Kakadia said that however, Association could not safeguard the interest of its members. Shri Prabodh B Patel said that issue has been taken up repeatedly with the Management, but without no outcome due to adamant attitude of the ETL Management.

Shri N K Navadia felt that if the members of ETL agree unanimously, issue of abnormal billing and impractical and unilateral procedures followed by ETL can be challenged in the Court of Law. After detailed discussion, it was decided to arrange a meeting of all ETL members with the ETL Management in the presence of representatives of AIA in the next week.

Shri Dinesh Patel pointed out that in the EC, conditions of tree plantation and 1% expenditure under ESR are stipulated. Shri Mahesh J Patel replied that issue has been taken up with the VC&MD/Chief Engineer, GIDC and proposed to allot vacant space for common tree plantation. Shri Jitendra B Patel, tree plantation for only show purpose should not be



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allowed. Shri Mahesh J Patel said that a project of planting 3000 trees in the housing area @ Rs. 700/tree is being implemented. Similarly, Notified Area Authority has planned plantation of 14,000 trees in the industrial sector and the plantation is in progress. Industries participating in this program will be issued a certificate, which they can utilize for EC purpose. Association has requested GIDC to reveal the Tree Plantation Account.

Shri Dinesh Patel said that the services of DGVCL are not satisfactory as stated in the Annual Report. Even the officers of DGVCL are not aware of the Rules of DGVCL. Up to 125 HP load, the connection is considered under LT connection. Shri Mahesh J Patel said that raising the limit of LT connection up to 200 HP is being taken up with the GERC. Shri Nainesh Radadia said that the Green Belt and vacant plots are encroached. Shri Mahesh J Patel said that issue has already been taken up with GIDC and requested to evacuate such unauthorised encroachments.

Shri Jivraj Kakadia said that the rate of Consolidated Tax of Notified Area is raised every year. No action is taken to recover the tax from the defaulters for year together. Notified Area should not introduce any tax waiver scheme, but should take strong action to recover the tax arrears. Shri Mahesh J Patel said that the matter will be taken up in the Board. Shri N K Navadia said that since formation of the Board, no waiver scheme has been allowed. Similarly, GIDC should not launch any such scheme without consulting Association.

Shri Jivraj Kakadia said that the road carpeting work should be started soon after monsoon and the most damaged roads should get priority. Condition of road upto Sub Station is very poor. Shri Jitendra B Patel said that tender for road work was floated, but the work of agency was not found satisfactory. Hence work stopped. But due to enormous pressure from the higher authorities, we had to allow the agency to carry out patch work.

Shri Sharad Gabani felt that the drainage cess should be abolished, as the industries are not having drainage connection. Shri Mahesh J Patel said that on completion of over-ground drainage line work, the rate of drainage cess will be drastically reduced. Shri Jivraj Kakadia said that the cleaning of SWD is not carried out effectively. Shri Mahesh J Patel said that tender of such works are based on actual volume of the work.

Shri Jayesh H Patel felt that as to why industries should pay drainage cess without drainage connection. Expenditure of Drainage Division is huge than the actual income. HUS line is laid by NCT, but NAA is undertaking maintenance and repairs of this line with huge expenditure. Issue was taken up in the Board. Shri N K Navadia said that ETL members do not have drainage connection, even though they have to pay drainage cess. This issue should therefore be considered in the meeting of ETL members. Shri Mahesh J Patel said that proposal for recovering drainage cess from the housing sector is under consideration to balance the expenditure of Drainage Division and to avoid spending from tax amount.

Resolution:

“It was unanimously resolved to start recovering drainage cess from the housing sector, so that tax amount is not spent for drainage maintenance of housing sector as well as to balance the expenditure of drainage division”.

Dr. C K Giriya pointed out that the underground water level is going down day-to-day. NAA should think about rainwater harvesting as a solution to this problem. Shri Mahesh J



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Patel said that rainwater harvesting project has been started and the housing societies which successfully erect rainwater harvesting system are being encouraged with subsidy of Rs.15,000/=. All medium/large industries are requested to develop ponds of nearby areas for water conservation under CSR fund.

Dr. Giriya pointed out of disposal of waste in public places by the people. Such people should be found and penalized. Shri Mahesh J Patel said that staff in NAA for this and other purpose is being recruited. The District Collector has been requested to allow usage of share of Comprehensive Development Fund for infrastructure development in Notified Area limits, for which the Notification needs to be rectified properly.

Shri Umesh Savalia said that private agencies are drawing water from bore-wells for commercial purpose. Shri Mahesh Patel said that on fully completion of infrastructure development, this issue will be solved.

Shri Umesh Savalia said that for tree plantation, plants/saplings are sought from outside, though the Plant Ecology Study Centre is available in the Estate. Shri Dinesh Patel said that efforts are on to provide saplings and tree plantation in residential area since last two years. Circular seeking applications for plantation 40 trees for Rs. 1000/= has been mailed to all industries, but very poor response.

12. Ratification of decision of Managing Committee:

Shri Jayesh H Patel, Hon. General Secretary informed that as was decided in last Annual General Meeting, the office has invited manufacturing documents from the industries. On verification of documents, it was found that 212 industries either did not submit documents or submitted invalid documents. Similarly 27 members themselves intimated in writing that they are not in manufacturing and some are having multiple membership on single power connection.

The Managing Committee in its meeting held on 22/03/2019 decided to convert the membership of industries which did not submit the requisite documents or submitted invalid documents to Associate Membership as well as to delete membership of industries which made self-declaration of non-manufacturing and multiple membership on single power connection. It was also decided to regularise the Associate Membership as and when such industries submit valid documents.

The General Body took note of the facts and ratified the decision of Managing Committee to convert membership of 212 industries to Associate Membership for submitting invalid documents or not submitting documents as well as to delete/remove the membership of 27 industries which either made self-declaration of non-manufacturing in writing and multiple memberships on single power connection by keeping membership having real power connection.

Shri Jayesh H Patel also declared that the office is issuing new life membership certificates and smart identity cards soon to the members.

13. Swearing in of new office bearers for the year 2019-20:

Shri Natubhai B Patel, Vice President expressed thanks to the outgoing office bearers and then invited the new office bearers elected in the adjourned Managing Committee meeting



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held on 26/07/2018, to join the dais. Accordingly following newly elected office bearers came on stage and took oath to honour, observe and abide by the constitution of the organization:

1. Shri Mahesh J Patel : President
2. Shri Jayesh H Patel : Vice President
